# SPOTLIGHT ON SUCCESS: THREE YEARS OF IMPACT IN CHATTANOOGA

It's hard to believe that three years have passed since Project Return began serving the Chattanooga community, and what a journey it has been! Our mission is to foster hope and opportunity for people returning from incarceration, and the progress we've made in Chattanooga is a true testament to that mission.

In just three years, we've served over **700 participants**, each receiving the personalized support they need to build sustainable lives after incarceration. Our social enterprises, PROe and PROPS, have been crucial in this work, offering job readiness and real employment opportunities. These ventures have not only created jobs but have also bridged gaps in the local workforce by partnering with **20 local employers** to place qualified, eager workers.

Through our social enterprises, we've provided employment to **243 participants**, helping them build stable futures. Additionally, we're excited to announce the upcoming launch of PROh, our affordable housing initiative designed to address one of the most pressing barriers returning citizens face: safe and affordable housing.

As we celebrate this milestone, we're incredibly proud of how far we've come and eager for what's to come. With a growing network of partners and ongoing support from the community, Project Return Chattanooga is poised to continue making an even greater impact in the years ahead.



Meet Victor Dyson – pictured left with Senator Ed Jackson after a recent presentation to Tennessee State Senators. His journey is a remarkable testament to resilience and the power of second chances. After being incarcerated for 6 years, he connected with Project Return within a week of his release, determined to rebuild his life. Without reliable transportation, Victor took a position through our PROe initiative, where he worked for several months before being hired on permanently. In a full-circle moment, Victor became our Transportation Coordinator, driving our vans and ensuring that participants can get to and from work safely. Victor has also been a PROh tenant for 2.5 years, continuing his journey of growth and stability with Project Return by his side.

His story is a powerful reminder of the potential that lies in each of us and the impact of opportunity and support.

#### FROM THE CEO

Throughout this edition, we've highlighted several of the events, activities and progress of our participants. There has also been some substantive internal organizational work done by the incredible staff team at Project Return.
